

ALL ABOUT CATS

Most people love cats, and half of all homes in Aotearoa have a companion cat in their family!

Cats spend most of their time catnapping — 15 hours on average per day. During their waking hours, most cats can be found grooming themselves (for up to half of their time awake), searching for food or patrolling their territory. Did you know that cats walk using both right feet then both left feet, like giraffes and camels?

Ears

A cat's ears can tell you a lot about how they are feeling. Forward-facing ears could mean a cat is happy or curious. Ears turned to the side or flattened most likely means they are angry or scared.

If you have ever been bitten by a cat, you will know that they have small, but very sharp teeth. These teeth are designed for catching small animals.

PAWS

Cats sweat through their paws to cool themselves off, and they will pant if they are too hot.

Eyes

Because they are natural hunters, cats have incredible vision. They can actually see better in the dark. This is one of the reasons why cats are so active at night time.

LIFESPAN

Cats live for around 12 to 15 years, but they can sometimes live to be over 20 years old.
Did you know the oldest cat ever recorded lived to be 38 years old? Wow!

Cats usually purr when they are feeling content. However, cats are masters at hiding their illnesses or injuries and they may also purr if they are stressed or hurt.

CAT HISS-TORY

The domestic cat can be traced back over 4,000 years to ancient Egypt and Africa, when cats were kept to stop rodents from eating crops. Today, cats are the most popular companion animal in the world – there are over 500 million domesticated cats worldwide. That's one cat for every 15 humans!

In just seven years, one cat and her offspring can produce over 370,000 kittens. ALWAYS spay and neuter your companion animals! Not only does this help prevent cat homelessness, it also keeps your kitty cat in better health and they are likely to live much longer.



Cat Rescue is a charitable trust whose mission is to reduce the population of homeless cats in Canterbury. Their focus is on desexing stray cats and rehoming them wherever possible. Feral kitties who can't be socialised are released. You can learn more by visiting their website.

CATS IN TROUBLE

DESIGNER DNA

All cats are wonderful, right? But some people want a purebred cat because of their distinctive characteristics like a long coat or large ears. Unfortunately, what many people don't know is these breeds can also have severe health problems such as kidney, breathing or heart conditions.

Moggies, commonly found at shelters, are

much less likely to suffer from these issues and are just as deserving of love.



Many pet shops help to rehome animals from the SPCA or another local shelter, which is fantastic! Some, however, will purchase their animals from breeders who may not be desexed or vaccinated. Because selling animals is a business to these pet shops and breeders, some put making money ahead of the needs of the animal and the animals can suffer.





HOMELESSNESS

In New Zealand, there are too many homeless cats and not enough homes for them. This means a large number of cats are put down because people choose to buy their puss from a breeder or pet shop.

HOW YOU CAN HELP

MAKE A LIFELONG COMMITMENT

Cats need more than just lots of love. They need to be spayed or neutered so they don't have kittens that will need rehoming. They will also need veterinary care, which can be very expensive, especially as a cat gets older. Cats can live for a long time (up to 20 years). Do you and your family have what is needed to give a kitty a full and happy life?



SAVE A LIFE

If your family does decide to bring a fur baby into your home, make sure you adopt them from an animal shelter. Contact a local shelter, like Cat Rescue or the SPCA, and save a life!

INGREDIENTS

- 2 C corn kernels
- 1/2 C finely chopped onions
- 2 cloves of garlic, crushed
- 1 C flour
- 1/2 C water
- Salt and pepper to taste
- · 2 tsp oil

METHOD

- 1. Mix all the ingredients, except for the oil, to make a thick batter.
- 2. Heat the oil in a frypan over low-medium heat.
- 3. Spoon the batter into the pan, making sure your fritters are equal in size.
- 4. When the bottom is golden, flip the fritter over and cook the other side.
- 5. Serve with your favourite sauce and enjoy.
